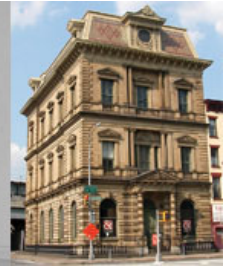

**OPEN CALL TO STUDENT ARTISTS**  
**“THE NEW ACADEMY: WAH BRIDGES STUDENT ARTISTS”**  
Curated by Rebecca Cuomo

**Show Dates: Saturday, October 4 – Sunday, October 12**

**Opening Reception: Saturday, October 4, 6-8 PM**

The word “academy” often elicits an antiquated institution: rigidly conservative and ossified in tradition, concerned with distinguishing the “fine arts” from the arts of “craft” or “trade.” While this notion may have been true for hundreds of years in the history of art, this exhibition seeks to revisit our perception of the academy. Here, the academy is understood as an organized institution that fosters the individual and professional growth of artists through instruction, critique, theoretical debate, mentorship, intellectual stimulation, and an emphasis on individual interest, ideas, and creative freedom. Thus, the academy becomes a fluid concept – introducing the idea of a heterogeneous and evolutionary “academic style” that varies depending on time, place, institution, teacher, and student.

The WAH Center presents **“THE NEW ACADEMY: WAH BRIDGES STUDENT ARTISTS”** – a multi-media group art exhibition dedicated to presenting the work of students pursuing their BFA or MFA degrees at New York City art schools – the ultimate “post-academy” academies. Based on the Bridge Concept envisioned by WAH Center Founder & Artistic Director, Yuko Nii, the aim is to create a bridge between the WAH Center’s historical landmark building and a new generation of outstanding young artists, as well as a bridge between academic styles, understood in this context as a temporal artistic style that describes the work of a student. Artists are encouraged to submit artworks in the medium of their choosing. We invite the submission of: painting; drawing; photography; collage; installation; printmaking (serigraphy, woodcut, etching, lithograph, etc.); sculpture; installation; video art; architectural models; etc.

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We are now accepting submissions for **“THE NEW ACADEMY: WAH BRIDGES STUDENT ARTISTS”**

**Eligibility:** Artists enrolled in a BFA or MFA program in any New York City school

**Deadline: Monday, September 22, 2014**

**Submission Fee:** \$15 for one artwork submission, \$5 for each additional submission. Limit 3 submissions. Can be paid by cash or check (**payable to WAH Center: 135 Broadway, Brooklyn, NY 11211**). Submissions must be sent via e-mail to: [wahstudentart@gmail.com](mailto:wahstudentart@gmail.com) and must include the following information:

- 1) A completed entry form (please see attached)
- 2) Image files (jpeg, png, or tiff files, at least 72 dpi) of artwork submissions titled with the appropriate information as follows: “ArtistName\_Submission#\_ArtworkTitle\_Medium\_Dimensions\_Date\_Edition#”  
Please note: High-resolution files may be shared via Google Docs
- 3) Artist statement (limit 1 page), CV (limit 2 pages), and a brief biography paragraph including the school you currently attend, your major, expected degree and graduation year
- 4) Note of how submission fee has been/will be paid

**Submissions will not be considered until all of the above has been received.**

Unsold works must be picked up by the specified pick-up day. **The storage fee is charged \$10/day for each work when work remains after the specific pick-up date.**

### **Instruction Details for Accepted “THE NEW ACADEMY: WAH BRIDGES STUDENT ARTISTS”**

**Show Dates: Saturday, October 4 – Sunday, October 12**

**Opening Reception: Saturday, October 4, 6-8 PM**

#### **REQUIREMENTS FOR ACCEPTED WORK:**

- 1) A completed entry form (please see attachments)
- 2) Paid submission fees: \$15 submission fee for 1 piece, \$5 for each additional piece. The maximum number of submissions is 3.
- 3) Please have work signed (and numbered, if applicable)
- 4) Accepted works should be framed (unless otherwise arranged)
- 5) A label must be affixed to the back of the work, indicating which end is the top and the following: Artist's Name, Title, Medium, Dimensions, Date Produced, Edition # (if applicable), and Sale Price. This information must correspond to the submitted works listed on the completed entry form
- 6) We do not accept pieces too fragile to handle
- 7) Works cannot be withdrawn before the end of the exhibition

#### **DELIVERY INSTRUCTIONS:**

**Hand Delivery Dates: Tuesday, September 30, 1-5 PM  
Wednesday, October 1, 6-9 PM**

**Deliver work to side entrance on Bedford Avenue:**

- 1) Ring bell for admittance
- 2) Bring artwork to the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor gallery & check in at reception desk
- 3) Artwork must be clearly labeled on the front and back
- 4) Take all wrapping materials with you, as we do not have additional storage space
- 5) If you are delivering editions of a print, please bring any plastic protective sheets, envelopes, etc. that you would like to keep them in. One edition copy will be exhibited, the others will be kept in the gallery so that more than one edition is available for purchase.

#### **EXHIBITION BINDER:**

For viewers interested in knowing more about the exhibiting artists, we compile an exhibition binder containing information of participating artists. We ask for the following in plastic protective sheets (USA standard 8.5" x11" with 3 punched holes):

- 1) Current resume (limited to 2 pages) with your name, school affiliation, expected graduation date & degree, and major at the top. Do not include any contact information
- 2) Artist's Statement (limited to 1 page)
- 3) 2 images of additional artworks not included in the show
